Mission Central, Inc.	Medical Equipment Distribution: This project will help Mission Central Expand its program to repair and reuse used medical equipment to assist with needs that have grown as a result of the pandemic.	\$ 50,000.00
Alternative Behavior Consultants	Therapeutic counseling sessions and Educational Services to parents and children will be provided in the home at times when parental stress or familial discord is at risk to children, addressing the mental and physical needs of children by supporting the stabilization of the family system.	\$ 323,130.00
Tomorrow's Neighbors	Reentry Housing Solution: The Cumberland House, that will centralize reentry services in Cumberland County, and provide safe, supportive, and affordable housing to 10-15 Returning Citizens at a time. This funding will provide declining financial support over a 5 year period while the program develops and develops sustainable funding.	\$ 1,000,000.00
Family Promise of Harrisburg Capital Region (FPHCR)	Homelessness assistance: Provides assistance to families that are facing homelessness by helping them to find shelter and safe places as well as providing basic hygiene items.	\$ 51,450.00
The Salvation Army	Rent and Mortgage Assistance: Funds will be used to support direct housing assistance to those with mental illness and people who are struggling to get back on their feet as a result of the Covid epidemic	\$ 204,000.00

New Visions of South Central PA, Inc.	Repairs at New Visions facility to allow them to continue providing psychiatric and case management services.	\$ 71,862.00
Family Health Council of Central PA	Funds will support delivery of services in the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) in the county. The WIC program provides nutritional counseling, breastfeeding support, and healthy food vouchers to low income pregnant and postpartum women and children up to the age of five.	\$ 381,170.00
Downtown Counseling Center	Provides funding to purchase (preferred) or lease existing office space in northeast Cumberland County to establish a second mental health clinic to meet the expanding mental health needs of children, teens, and adults in Cumberland County, especially among the impoverished and underserved.	\$ 450,000.00
Bethany House of Cumberland County, Inc.	Transitional Support for young females that have aged out of foster care. This project includes the addition of a Housing Stability Coach, Independent Living Case Manager, Mental Health & Wellness Counselor, housing assistance for young adults with mental illness within Bethany House and the community	\$ 150,000.00
UPMC Child Advocacy Center of Central PA	Supports hiring two staff for the satellite office of the UPMC child advocacy center of Central PA in Carlisle which specializes in mental health assessment and counseling to children, 0-18 years for those that may have experienced sexual or physical abuse, neglect, or witnessed a violent crime.	\$ 146,547.00

Pennsylvania Elks Major Projects	This project will provide a specially trained experienced nurse who will offer free community support to persons with intellectual disabilities, and the families who care for them. The nurse will take services directly to the homes of the persons served or to anywhere in the community where an advocate may be needed.	\$ 54,245.00
The Pennsylvania State University – College of Medicine	This project creates a Community Psychiatry Residency Track at Holy Spirit Hospital increasing the practitioner hours available in Cumberland County for psychiatric services.	\$ 1,252,304.00
Sadler Health Center	Supports the building construction for a new Sadler health facility in Mechanicsburg.	\$ 2,000,000.00
The Som Foundation	Purchase of a building in Carlisle that will serve as both as an office location for staff who provide family support services such as basic needs, job skill development, money mgt, life skills like stress mgt, and assistance to find and access mental and physical health care. The building would also provide temporary housing for families that need it.	\$ 130,200
CONTACT Helpline	Improves capacity for the 211 helpline service for Cumberland County to help people in need get information and referrals for housing, shelter, food, medical services, mental health services, rent payment assistance, and utility assistance.	\$ 50,000
Hope House of Cumberland Valley	These funds will be used to purchase a large home to support stable living space for 5 to 6 women while they work to find permanent housing while they recover from emotional trauma of domestic abuse.	\$ 100,000
